His roles have combined, in different ways, three key elements of cultural engagement: access, learning and interpretation. Through learning programmes, community engagement, exhibition making and gallery development, Pete has helped audiences and partners engage with human history, historic houses and grounds; fine and decorative art; science and technology and natural history (including living animals).

Pete has been the lead or a key player in a number of grant-aided projects, responsible for activity planning, implementation and evaluation. He is used to working in teams with colleagues and external partners such as designers and constructors. He also has many years experience of audience development work, particularly on externally funded projects, involving visitors and users in the development of new activities, interpretation and learning materials as advisors, sounding boards and partners for piloting ideas.

Much of Pete's work has set out to align with and contribute to local and regional agendas such as community cohesion and regeneration, which has meant interacting with a broad range of people, from teachers and community groups to elected members and trustees.

Since 2015, Pete has been Course Director for the Foundation Course: Museum Learning, which he developed for the Group for Education in Museums (GEM.

Pete is also an Associate Tutor on the Glasgow University MSc course in Museum Education, helping postgraduate students turn theory into practice.
